
About Laterite



Examples of our work

Quantitative data collection partner for Gender & Adolescence: Global Evidence

Overseas Development Institute (ODI)

GAGE is a large-scale longitudinal study that aims to collect data on adolescent wellbeing with a focus on gender in a range of countries. In Ethiopia, Laterite worked with the GAGE consortium to collect this data, including through a large-scale impact evaluation of over 8,000 adolescent boys and girls in Ethiopia on topics such as health and wellbeing, education, voice and agency, and economic empowerment.

Midline and endline data collection for impact evaluation of the Strengthen PSNP4 Institutions and Resilience (SPIR) Development Food Security Activity (DFSA)

International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI)

The SPIR DFSA is a five-year project supporting implementation of Productive Safety Nets Project (PSNP) Ethiopia. IFPRI carried out randomized controlled trial (RCT) impact evaluation of the SPIR DFSA to compare the impact of different combinations of livelihood and nutrition components of the project on measures of household wellbeing, food security, child and maternal nutritional status and related outcomes. For the RCT.

Laterite collected quantitative data across a sample of 4,300 households in the most remote areas of Oromia and Amhara at midline and endline, including anthropometric measurements of recent mothers and their infants. Laterite also carried out an additional household listing exercise across 180 kebeles. The survey included detailed socio-economic modules and sensitive modules related to IPV, maternal depression, and GBV.

Tracking impacts of economic reforms in urban areas

World Bank

The World Bank and Laterite conducted a longitudinal Urban High-Frequency Survey among a representative panel of urban households in Ethiopia to monitor the impacts of the Homegrown Reforms Package, which aims to support economic growth and poverty reduction. Laterite assisted in designing the survey, and implemented data collection for an in-person baseline survey and three quarterly follow-up phone survey rounds. For the phone surveys, Laterite developed dashboard with a key indicators to enable the World Bank to observe changes We over time. successfully interviewed 3,000 households at baseline; 2,633 for the first round of phone surveys; 2,436 for the second round: and 2.275 for the third.

Understanding the Context for Teaching and Learning in Ethiopia

Mastercard Foundation

Laterite conducted a scoping study focusing on three educational systems in Ethiopia: secondary education, TVET and non-formal education for adults. We analyzed available statistics on teaching institutions, students and teachers/trainers, and conducted key informant interviews with stakeholders in Ethiopia's educational system. The results were used to create systems maps focusing on the framework of policy, governance, and financing. The first phase of the project focused on Addis Ababa and the federal level; and the second was country-wide and focused on regional variations. It also included education in emergencies.

Randomized controlled trial (RCT) to evaluate the impact of incentives on stumping uptake

HereWeGrow & TechnoServe

TechnoServe's Coffee Farm College is a two-year program that trains farmers to stump their old coffee trees. To understand how to provide additional motivation, Laterite developed the 'Tools For Stumping' pilot alongside TechnoServe and HereWeGrow. This pilot program provided coffee farmers with agricultural tools in exchange for their use of the stumping best practice. The pilot was expanded in 2022, to target 23,000 coffee farming households in Sidama. Laterite designed and led an RCT evaluation of this expansion, using a variety of econometric and machine learning methods to estimate relationship between tool-based incentives and stumping adoption.

Post Distribution Monitoring of Rural Productive Safety Net Program (PSNP5) recipients in conflict-affected areas

World Bank

The conflict and security challenges in Northern Ethiopia have posed significant challenges on the implementation of the PSNP in Tigray, Amhara and Afar regions. Laterite surveyed 220 households living in Amhara and Afar, to monitor PSNP beneficiaries' access to food and/or cash assistance in conflictaffected areas. Laterite managed all data collection and analysis, and reported findings to federal and regional stakeholders.
