
About Laterite

We have offices in Rwanda, Ethiopia, Kenya, Sierra Leone, Tanzania, Uganda, and the Netherlands, with a team of over 85 full-time researchers and data experts, based primarily in East Africa.

Laterite Kenya specializes in longterm embedded research advisory projects, as well as monitoring and evaluation (M&E). Our team in Nairobi includes both research and data collection specialists. We work with a roster of over 260 trained local enumerators who carry out both inperson and remote data collection. Our enumerators are competitively recruited, hold Bachelor's degrees, and are fluent in local languages as well as English and Swahili. We have worked across Kenya on topics including gender and nutrition, agriculture, public health, livelihoods, education, and migration.



Embedded research advisory and decision-focused research for IGNITE

Tanager

Impacting Gender & Nutrition through Innovative Technical Exchange Agriculture (IGNITE) program is a five year multi-country initiative implemented by Tanager. The program aims to strengthen African institutions' ability to integrate nutrition-sensitive and gender-integrated approaches their agriculture interventions and way of doing business. Laterite provides M&E support to Tanager participating IGNITE clients in Ethiopia, Nigeria, Burkina Faso and Tanzania on a variety of technical assistance, capacity building, monitoring, data collection and evaluation activities. Laterite also leads mixed-methods research to support clients to make evidence-based decisions about genderand nutrition-sensitive agriculture programming.

Randomized controlled trial (RCT) of the Grevillea Tree Program in Kenya

One Acre Fund

Laterite designed and implemented baseline and midline studies with 1.850 treatment and control farmers to measure the impact of One Acre Fund's Grevillea Tree Program in Kericho and Uasin Gishu counties in Kenya. The study also aimed to investigate the opportunity costs of planting trees compared to other income generating activities. Along with quantitative surveys at baseline and midline, Laterite also led focus group discussions with farmers to give a nuanced picture of perceptions of planting and use in communities; phone surveys with a subsample of farmers interviewed at baseline and midline; and a market study to establish the prices of grevillea trees in the study areas. Due to COVID-19, the endline study took a qualitative approach to ensure respondent health and safety.

Phone survey targeting 2,100 refugee

research approvals, recruiting and
training enumerators, and carrying out
data collection, monitoring, cleaning
and field reporting.

Data collection for longitudinal study of pregnant women in Kitui and Kiambi counties

Kenya Medical Research Institute (KEMRI) - Wellcome Trust

The QuEST Network is conducting a of longitudinal study women's experiences during pregnancy and childbirth in Kenya, Ethiopia, South Africa, and India. In Kenya, this study follows 1.000 women at 20 health facilities throughout their pregnancy via monthly surveys. KEMRI conducts the baseline and endline surveys in person, and Laterite conducts the monthly phone survey modules. Laterite is also developing an Electronic Data Capture System and database hosting for all modules, training enumerators, and carrying out piloting, data quality control and cleaning, and frequent transfer of data to the client.
